Our teaching staff deserve significant recognition for their efforts in preparing classrooms and learning environments. Over the break, teachers have worked collaboratively, planning carefully to create spaces that stimulate curiosity and support every child's learning journey from day one.

As we launch into the year, I am excited to share some developments enhancing our learning community:

- Central to everything we do is our ongoing commitment to continuous improvement. Our 2026 School Improvement Plan will have a focus around two main goals:
  1. We want our students to be effective literacy and numeracy learners who can articulate their thoughts and ideas clearly and confidently.
  2. We want our students to be active partners in their learning, collaborating with both teachers and peers to create a dynamic and engaging educational experience.
- OSHC Redevelopment: Planning is underway to improve our Out of School Hours Care space, ensuring it continues to meet the needs of our growing school population.
- Greenhouse and Propagation Station: Our environmental program is expanding, with a new greenhouse and propagation station providing opportunities for hands-

on science and sustainability learning. Our Greenhill Living, environmental program, will begin in week 4 of this term.

- Student Parliament: We are further developing our Student Parliament, empowering students to actively shape school life and build leadership capacity at all ages.

Felicity and I recently had the privilege of undertaking the Harvard Family Engagement course with Dr Karen Mapp over the holidays. This experience reaffirmed our belief in the importance of strong, authentic partnerships between home and school. This year, you will see an even greater focus on meaningful parent engagement, with many opportunities for dialogue, shared learning, and celebration.
